RECYCLING GUIDELINES: WHAT IS RECYCLABLE?

ALLOWED IN THE RECYCLING CAN

Cans/Jars:

Glass bottles & jars .
Tin and aluminum cans
Aerosol cans (EMPTY only)
Metal jar lids

Paper:

Corrugated cardboard (flattened)
Paperboard boxes (e.g. cereal, pasta & tissue boxes)
Newspapers & inserts (no bags)
Magazines, brochures and catalogues
Mail & greeting cards
Junk mail and window envelopes
Office paper
Photo paper, wrapping paper, tissue paper
File folders
Phone books
Paperback books
Hardcover books with the cover removed
Paper bags
Empty paper and toilet paper rolls (the core)
Shredded paper
Juice boxes
Tented juice cartons

Plastics:

Any plastic marked with a symbol from 1-7 as shown below are recyclable.



Pourable Plastic Containers — milk cartons, water bottles, detergent containers, shampoo bottles, yogurt containers, etc.

Rigid Plastic — spackle buckets, children's pool, outdoor plastic chair, plastic cooler, plastic drinking cup, laundry basket, etc.

NOT ALLOWED IN THE RECYCLING CAN

Plastic bags of any kind (trash or shopping bags)

Aluminum foil
Waxed paper or waxed cardboard
Pizza boxes
Microwavable trays
Containers from frozen food
Light bulbs
Mirrors
Window or auto glass
Drinking glasses
Glass cookware
Ceramics, porcelain, china, vases
Tissues, paper towels, napkins
Styrofoam & paper to-go containers
Plastic 6-pack holders
Batteries
Tires
Paint cans (empty or full)
Wire hangers
Wire of any kind
Christmas lights
Appliances (e.g. toasters, TVs, etc.)

No Need to Remove from Recyclables:

Tape, paper clips, staples, stamps, labels, metal fasteners, rubber bands, plastic tabs, post-it notes.

Recycling Tips:

- * Empty and lightly rinse all containers
- * DO NOT tie up newspapers and cardboard – just throw in can
- * Use a trash can with a lid to ensure that papers do not blow away or get wet
- * Trash cans may be no larger than 35 gallons or over 50 lbs.
- * DO NOT PUT RECYCLABLES IN PLASTIC BAGS/TRASH BAGS
