

Chapter 10: Recycling and Solid Waste Plan

Recycling

Wall Township currently operates a curbside recycling program for newspaper, leaves and brush commingled, glass, plastic bottles, aluminum and metal cans. In addition, the Township operates a Recycling Center for drop-off items at the Public Works Garage on Tilton Corners Road. Newspapers and commingled cans and bottles are picked up once a month.

Solid Waste

Wall Township is in compliance with the State Recycling Goals by virtue of its inclusion and participation in the Monmouth County Solid Waste District. Presently, solid waste generated by residents in Wall Township is collected at curbside by Township personnel and disposed at the Monmouth County Reclamation Center in Tinton Falls. Commercial establishments have contracts with private disposal companies to remove solid waste on an as-needed or periodic basis. Private haulers also utilize the County's facility. Because Monmouth County has been able to expand landfill capacity as required to accommodate solid waste flows, the Township agreement with the Monmouth County Reclamation Center is expected to continue for the foreseeable future

In accordance with the Municipal Land Use Law, Wall Township requires that residential and non-residential developments are designed to accommodate recycling areas within the development proposal. The Wall provision is contained in subsection 500B3.B of the Land Use and Development Regulations.
