

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE
TOWNSHIP OF WALL, HELD IN THE
MEETING ROOM, MUNICIPAL COMPLEX
WEDNESDAY, MARCH 8, 2000**

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Robert D. Peters at 8:00 P.M. Present were Mayor Peters presiding, Deputy Mayor Frank Addonizio, Committeewoman Mary L. Burne, Committeeman Michael D. Fitzgerald, Committeeman Edward H. Thomson, Township Administrator Joseph L. Verruni, Township Attorney Roger J. McLaughlin and Lorraine Kubacz, Acting Township Clerk.

Roll-call was taken by Lorraine Kubacz.

Following the Salute to the Flag and Moment of Silence, the Mayor read the Sunshine Statement in the usual form.

Deputy Mayor Addonizio moved that the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of February 2, 2000, and February 9, 2000, be approved as per copies submitted by the Clerk's office. Committeeman Fitzgerald seconded the motion and all members voted yes.

Committeeman Fitzgerald presented a Proclamation to William O'Connell - Grand Marshall of the St. Patrick's Day Parade. Mr. Fitzgerald congratulated Mr. O'Connell for all his work on the parade. Mr. O'Connell thanked the Committee for this recognition.

With reference to the Introduction of **ORDINANCE NO. 9-2000** - Bond Ordinance - Sewer Improvements, entitled "BOND ORDINANCE AMENDING IN PART BOND ORDINANCE NO. 11-1999 ADOPTED ON MAY 12, 1999, PROVIDING FOR SEWER IMPROVEMENTS TO NORTH WALL II, IN ORDER TO EXPAND THE SCOPE OF THE IMPROVEMENTS AUTHORIZED THEREBY, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF WALL, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY," Mrs. Kubacz read the Ordinance by title only as required by law. Committeeman Burne moved that the Ordinance be adopted. Committeeman Thomson seconded and on roll call, members voted as follows:

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There being five yeas and no nays, the Mayor declared the Ordinance adopted as to its first reading. Committeewoman Burne moved that the Clerk advertise the Ordinance according to law, the second reading and public hearing to be held April 12, 2000 at 8:00 P.M. Committeeman Thomson seconded the motion and all members voted yes.

With reference to the Introduction of **ORDINANCE NO. 10-2000** - Authorizing Execution of Lease Agreements with North Wall Little League, South Wall Little League, Wall Pop Warner and Wall Soccer Club, entitled "AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WALL AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF LEASE AGREEMENTS WITH THE NORTH WALL LITTLE LEAGUE, SOUTH WALL LITTLE LEAGUE, WALL POP WARNER AND WALL SOCCER CLUB FOR PREMISES DESIGNATED AS BLOCK 124, LOT 15; BLOCK 799, LOT 57; BLOCK 381, LOT 26; AND BLOCK 272, LOT 1 ON THE TAX MAP OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WALL," Mrs. Kubacz read the Ordinance by title only as required by law. Committeeman Fitzgerald moved that the Ordinance be adopted. Deputy Mayor Addonizio seconded and on roll call, members voted as follows:

Deputy Mayor Addonizio seconded the motion and all members voted yes.

It being the advertised date for the Second Reading and Public Hearing of **ORDINANCE NO. 3-2000** - Amending Personnel Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WALL AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER II, "ADMINISTRATION," SECTION 2-4, "PERSONNEL POLICIES", AND SUBSECTION 2-4.3 "GENERAL EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES", OF "THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WALL, 1977", AS AMENDED AND SUPPLEMENTED," Mrs. Kubacz read the Ordinance by title only as required by law. The Mayor declared the public hearing open. There being no comments or objections, Committeeman Thomson moved that the public hearing be closed. Committeewoman Burne seconded the motion and all

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members voted yes. Committeeman Thomson moved that the Ordinance be adopted as to its second reading and final passage. Committeewoman Burne seconded the motion and on roll-call, members voted as follows:

There being five yeas and no nays, the Mayor declared the Ordinance adopted. Committeeman Thomson moved that the Ordinance be advertised according to law. Committeewoman Burne seconded the motion and all members voted yes.

It being the advertised date for the Second Reading and Public Hearing of **ORDINANCE NO. 4-2000** - Allenwood Sewer Bond Ordinance entitled, "BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR SEWER IMPROVEMENTS TO ALLENWOOD, APPROPRIATING \$2,000,000 THEREFOR, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,900,000 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AND DIRECTING THE SPECIAL ASSESSMENT OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF WALL, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY," Mrs. Kubacz read the Ordinance by title only as required by law. Administrator Verruni gave a brief overview of the project. He explained that the \$2,000,000 is to develop sewers in the Allenwood section of the Township. The cost covers engineering fees, surveys as to where the sewers will go and their depth, and all other items needed to bid and award a contract. He further explained that Wall has three sewer plants that the Township uses, Neptune, Southern Monmouth Regional Sewer Authority and Manasquan River Regional Sewer Authority. Everyone received two letters as required, one certified and one regular mail, however, because of topography of the road, not everyone will receive sewers. This Ordinance effects some 400 properties, most designed to have gravity systems without pumps. Some will require ejector pumps. The Mayor declared the public hearing open.

Lon Harry, Ridgewood Road, stated he resides where ejector pumps will be necessary and most of the residences have septic systems in the back of their homes. He presented a list of twenty-five residents on Ridgewood Road, twenty-one of whom do not want sewers. Mr. Harry was also concerned

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about how emergency vehicles and school buses would fit through the street while the work is being done.

Attorney McLaughlin stated the purpose of the hearing is to bond appropriations to fund an engineering study. This Ordinance does not mean that everyone will be subject to assessment or get sewers. The Township has to wait until the study is completed to decide the scope of the sewers. He advised everyone if they do not benefit from the sewers, they will not get a sewer assessment. He further explained that the cost will come at the end of the installation of the sewers.

Mr. Harry asked if there is a State law which states if you need a pump you do not have to connect. Attorney McLaughlin replied no, with the other systems the Township has installed, it was mandatory to hook up even if there was an assessment for a pump. Mayor Peters explained that the Committee has capped the fee at \$3,000.

Alan Decker, Ridgewood Road, asked when the study will be done. Administrator Verruni replied that the entire project will be a little over a year.

Susan DeSimone, Castleton Court, stated she is in a new development with dry sewers and asked if this affected the cost and if there were any other fees. Attorney McLaughlin stated the standard assessment for dry sewers is set at \$2,100. Administrator Verruni stated there would be fees of approximately \$400-\$500. Also, the plumber will have to pay a connection fee to the Sewer Authority of approximately \$1,200. Ms. DeSimone also asked if Bay Pointe Engineering was authorized to start the study and when will the town go out to bid. Mr. Verruni stated that the Engineer is waiting for this Bond and the Township should go out to bid in about 6-8 months.

Wendy Clayton, Allaire Road, stated she did not receive a letter because the plans include sewers up to the house next door to her house. She would like to be included in the project. Committeewoman Burne stated that when the engineering study is done, if the work can be extended, it will be.

Nora Tramontano, Allenwood Road, asked where the hook up will be on her street. Ms. Tramontano stated that her system

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has been failing for years and she can't wait to get sewers. Mr. Verruni stated her property will be included in the project.

Peter Brown, Atlantic Avenue, asked if the sewers will eliminate the run off into Saw Mill. Administrator Verruni stated these are not storm sewers. Mr. Brown also asked how wide of an area is cleared to put in the line. Attorney McLaughlin stated generally ten feet.

Peter Onulak, Sandpiper Way, stated he fully supports the system because he has had many problems with his septic system and it is good for property values.

Trish Delpazzo, Allaire Road, also stated that she is in favor of the system.

Karrie Molinelli, Sandpiper Way, asked what a pumping station entailed and if it created an odor. Administrator Verruni stated a pumping station looks like a one car garage and would be finished with landscaping. He stated that typically there is no odor because the flow is continually moving through the line.

Gary Buck, Allenwood Road, asked why some residents received a letter asking where they would like to be hooked up and some did not. Administrator Verruni stated he would check into it, but it was probably an oversight.

Lon Harry, Ridgewood Road, asked about a major cable on Ridgewood Road. Mr. Verruni stated the Township is aware of it.

Patty Bachonsk, Saw Mill Lane, asked if the sidewalk is broken, would it be the homeowner's responsibility to fix it. Mr. Verruni stated that if the Township damages the sidewalk, they will fix it.

Thomas Moran, Saw Mill Lane, asked if sewers will eliminate drainage. Committeeman Fitzgerald stated it will not help with the drainage.

Deputy Mayor Addonizio explained the steps to be taken before the project is complete. He stated he has already been working with MRRSA for about two years, preparation of a topography map, design of the system, paperwork to the State,

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permits and review time will have an overall time of approximately fifty weeks. He further explained that many of the receiving systems are filling up and in the future may not be able to accept any more. He stated if we have an option to hook up now, it should be done.

There being no further comments or objections, Mayor Peters moved that the public hearing be closed. Committeeman Thomson seconded the motion and all members voted yes. Deputy Mayor Addonizio made a motion to amend the Ordinance to add Block 830 Lot 47 which was omitted. Committeeman Thomson seconded the motion and on roll-call members voted as follows:

It being the advertised date for the Second Reading and Public Hearing of **Ordinance No. 5-2000** - Building Department Fees entitled, "AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WALL AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER XI, "BUILDING AND HOUSING", SECTION 11-1, "UNIFORM

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CONSTRUCTION CODE ENFORCING AGENCY", SUBSECTION 11-1.3, "CONSTRUCTION FEE SCHEDULE" PERTAINING TO THE FEES TO BE CHARGED FOR PERMITS ISSUED BY THE BUILDING DEPARTMENT," Mrs. Kubacz read the Ordinance by title only as required by law. Mayor Peters explained that this Ordinance reduces the fees to be in compliance with the State fees. The Mayor declared the public hearing open.

Ed Morgan, Magnolia Avenue, asked if this Ordinance is being adopted to make sure fees are set by Ordinances only. Attorney McLaughlin responded this Ordinance changes the Building Department Ordinance so that the fee schedule can be changed by Resolution. Mr. Morgan stated that, with the Consent Agenda, this does not allow for public comment before adoption of a Resolution. Committeewoman Burne stated that when the Committee adopts the Consent Agenda, there is an opportunity for explanation of any items on the Agenda. Attorney McLaughlin stated that the Mayor reads a statement which states that these Resolutions are available for review before the meeting and a Consent Agenda is very common for routine items because it simplifies the meetings. He further stated that any member of the Committee can make a motion to remove an item from the Consent Agenda or, if it is adopted, the Committee can rescind or modify that Resolution. Mr. Morgan stated that the meeting should be open for public comment prior to the consent Agenda. Deputy Mayor Addonizio stated maybe the Committee should take under advisement adding some verbiage to allow for public comment before the Consent Agenda.

There being no further comments or objections, Committeewoman Burne moved that the public hearing be closed. Committeeman Fitzgerald seconded the motion and all members voted yes. Committeewoman Burne moved that the Ordinance be adopted as to its second reading and final passage. Committeeman Fitzgerald seconded the motion and on roll-call, members voted as follows:

The Mayor declared the public hearing open. There being no comments or objections, Deputy Mayor Addonizio moved that the public hearing be closed. Committeewoman Burne seconded the motion and all members voted yes. Deputy Mayor Addonizio moved that the Ordinance be adopted as to its second reading and final passage. Committeewoman Burne seconded the motion and on roll-call, members voted as follows:

There being five yeas and no nays, the Mayor declared the Ordinance adopted. Deputy Mayor Addonizio moved that the Ordinance be advertised according to law. Committeewoman Burne seconded the motion and all members voted yes.

It being the advertised date for the Second Reading and Public Hearing on 2000 Township of Wall Municipal Budget, Administrator Verruni explained that this year's budget has no tax increase in the municipal purpose tax rate. The Municipal purpose tax rate will be \$.451 per \$100 of assessed value. He further explained that the budget is funded from many areas including local taxes, State Aid, Building Department fees, Municipal Court fees, interest on taxes, investment income and

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two percent in grants. Mr. Verruni explained the expenditures include general government, the two largest areas which are Department of Public Works and Police, Reserve for Uncollected taxes, debt service and insurance. There will be no reduction in service and all departments will maintain a level of excellence. The Mayor declared the Public Hearing open.

Jeff Foster, President of Wall Township First Aid Squad, inquired as to when the Squad might expect the Township to supply it with a new ambulance. Committeeman Fitzgerald explained that the FIRST Committee had recommended the purchase of one new ambulance this year and that sufficient monies were in the capital budget to provide for bonding. Mr. Foster indicated that the FIRST Committee had recommended the purchase of two ambulances and not one.

Committeeman Fitzgerald indicated that Chief Hall had made his final recommendations to the Township Committee that one ambulance be purchased in 2000 and a second ambulance be purchased in 2001. The ambulances, as purchased, would be assigned to either the full time EMS squad or the volunteer squads, as the need is determined by Chief Hall after consultation with the FIRST Committee.

Chief Hall explained that the decision of the Committee resulted from the study done by the Township after the volunteer squads were having trouble meeting the demand for services. The Township Committee indicated they would dedicate more money to the squads if a fifteen-minute response time was met. After two years, there was still a problem with the response time. The Township hired paid EMS staff in October and the paid EMS response time is now about four minutes. The Chief indicated that the Police Department had repaired one ambulance which was not being used by the Wall First Aid Squad for use at minimal expense and confirmed that his recommendation was the purchase of one ambulance this year and a second ambulance next year. He indicated that the ambulances will be for everyone's use and not territorial.

Mr. Foster questioned if the Township Committee will continue to give the First Aid Squad \$10,000 per year. Committeeman Fitzgerald stated that \$10,000 for each squad has been appropriated in this year's budget. He further indicated that the Township Committee will take recommendations from the FIRST Committee and Chief Hall with respect to the maintenance of vehicles.

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Frank Pasatino, First Lieutenant of the squad, indicated that the squad supports the Township Committee and believes that the paid EMS squad should get anew rig but that Wall First Aid would also like a new one. Patrick Kane, First Lieutenant, stated that he would never have recommended purchasing only one rig this year. He also indicated a need for pagers necessary to increase response time. Chief Hall stated that pagers were purchased last year out of the police budget. Township Attorney McLaughlin inquired if the question of pagers was brought to the FIRST Committee. Chief Hall stated that he was aware of the need for pagers and radios and had already agreed to purchase them out of this year's police budget. However, the pagers that the squad wanted will not be available for purchase until this summer. Mr. McLaughlin reminded Mr. Kane that the purpose of the FIRST Committee was to discuss the needs of both first aid squads and emergency services in the Township in general and that all matters should be brought to the FIRST Committee by the squads.

There being no further comments or objections, Committeeman Fitzgerald moved that the public hearing be closed. Deputy Mayor Addonizio seconded the motion and all members voted yes. Mrs. Kubacz read **Resolution 00-303** entitled, "Declaring Eligibility to Participate in Self Examination of the Annual Budget." Committeeman Fitzgerald moved that the Resolution be adopted as to its second reading and final passage. Deputy Mayor Addonizio seconded the motion and on roll-call, members voted as follows:
