

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING  
OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE  
TOWNSHIP OF WALL, HELD IN THE  
MEETING ROOM, MUNICIPAL COMPLEX  
WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 13, 2002**

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The meeting was called to order by Mayor Thomson at 8:00 P.M. Present were Mayor Edward H. Thomson presiding, Deputy Mayor Mary L. Burne, Committee Robert D. Peters, Committeeman John P. Devlin, Committeeman Frank Addonizio, Township Administrator Joseph L. Verruni, Township Attorney Roger J. McLaughlin and Township Clerk Lorraine Kubacz.

Roll-call was taken by Lorraine Kubacz.

This being the advertised time for the Second Reading and Public Hearing of **ORDINANCE NO. 4-2002** - Amendments to Zoning Map entitled, "AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WALL, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, FURTHER AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WALL ADOPTED ON JULY 12, 2002." Mrs. Kubacz read the Ordinance by title only as required by law. Mayor Thomson explained that this ordinance involves several pieces of property. Several residents from Hurley Pond Road have commented on the rezoning along Route 138 from Route 35 to the Garden State Parkway which is now an OP zone. This property abuts Hurley Pond Road which is RR-6. The proposal is to change this to OP also. The ordinance was reviewed by the Planning Board and Township Engineer and it was recommended that, if this property is developed, there be no ingress or egress onto Hurley Pond Road. The residents on Hurley Pond Road have asked that this property not be changed to OP but remain RR-6. After consideration, the Township Committee agreed to amend the Ordinance to delete Section 1g, Block 772 Lot 5. The balance of the Ordinance concerns zones that were omitted in the Master Plan which need to be included. Mayor Thomson declared the Public Hearing open. There being no comments or objections, Committeeman Peters moved that the public hearing be closed. Committeeman Addonizio seconded the motion and all members voted yes. Committeeman Peters moved that the Ordinance be amended to delete Section 1g, Block 772 Lot 5. This being the advertised time for the Second Reading and Public Hearing of **ORDINANCE NO. 8-2002** - Bond Ordinance, Improvements to Route 34 Sanitary Sewer Extension entitled, "BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO THE ROUTE 34 SANITARY SEWER EXTENSION, APPROPRIATING \$840,000 THEREFOR, AUTHORIZED THE ISSUANCE OF \$798,000 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AND DIRECTING THE SPECIAL ASSESSMENT OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF WALL, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY." Mrs. Kubacz read the Ordinance by title only as required by law. Mayor Thomson declared the Public Hearing open.

Charles Payne, Ridgewood Road, asked if the finalized plans could be reviewed. Mr. Verruni replied that there is a general description of the project. This ordinance provides the funds for the Engineer to design the project.

Bill Pearce, Ridgewood Road, asked if his property would receive two assessments. Attorney McLaughlin answered that the appraiser will look at the property to determine if it should be two lots or not.

Dawson Embree, Ridgewood Road, stated that 3206 Ridgewood Road is 340 feet back from the road. Also 3208 Ridgewood Road is 400 feet back from the road. Mr. Embree asked if he would be exempt from the sewer because of this. Mayor Thomson replied that the appraiser will look at the property and determine if it should be exempt. The Township ordinance does exempt certain properties, but the appraiser will make that decision. Mr. Embree asked if he would be notified. Attorney McLaughlin replied that another letter will be mailed and there will be a hearing before the Township Committee to address any concerns. Mr. McLaughlin advised that Mr. Embree could apply for a waiver and the Township Committee would review it.

Victor Bruzek, Allenwood Road, asked what the assessment for the sewers covered. Administrator Verruni advised that the assessment has been capped at \$3,000 and the line will be put approximately fourteen to fifteen feet into the property line. From that point, it is the resident's responsibility to connect from the sewer line to the home. Mr. Bruzek asked if he would have to abandon the septic system. Mr. Verruni replied yes and that the Township has sewered most of the

neighborhoods because many people have failing septic systems. There is a requirement that everyone hook into the system and the cap for residents is \$3,000 which could be paid over a ten

year period at a low interest rate of 2-3%. Mr. Bruzek asked the Committee to consider further discussion of this.

Mr. Embree stated that a poll of the area determined that residents did not want the sewers. Mr. Verruni replied that most of the residents do want sewers. Mayor Thomson stated that the cost is considerably higher than what residents are being assessed but the residents have indicated that they want the sewers.

Charlie Wilkins, Ridgewood Road, stated that he is glad that this is being done and asked if the street will be repaved when it's complete. Mr. Verruni replied that it would be repaved.

There being no further comments or objections, Committeeman Devlin moved that the public hearing be closed. Deputy Mayor Burne seconded the motion and all members voted yes. A resident asked why the salary ordinance did not include the Chief of Police salary. Mr. Verruni advised that the Chief is not a member of a collective bargaining unit and the salary is on file. The resident asked if the new salaries would be paid in one lump sum. Mr. Verruni stated that they are retroactive to January 1 and salaries are paid every two weeks. The resident asked if the salaries included benefits and asked for a figure amount for benefits. Mr. Verruni

replied that the salaries did not include benefits which are about \$8,000. Health benefits are identical for all employees.

There being no further comments or objections, Committeeman Addonizio moved that the public hearing be closed. Committeeman Peters seconded the motion and all members voted yes. **Audience Participation**

Jim Stigliano, Sharp Road, asked what the credentials are for the person who was appointed Buildings and Grounds Supervisor, such as educational background. Also, Mr. Stigliano asked where was the job advertised publicly. Mr. Verruni stated that the job was advertised in the Public Works, Police and Municipal Buildings. Committeeman Peters stated that several applicants were interviewed and a recommendation was made. None of the applicants were asked their educational background. Mr. Grasso has served in a junior executive position with building and grounds experience. Mr. Stigliano stated that he applied for the position but was not given an interview. Mr. Peters stated that Mr. Stigliano had applied for a position with Recreation and that the position has been changed from Recreation to Buildings and Grounds. Mr. Stigliano stated that the position could have started at the low end of the scale.

Debbie Gallo, Lakewood Road, thanked the Township Committee for renaming Marigold Park to Heroes Park. Ms. Gallo stated that Mr. Niedermeyer was a Port Authority police officer who was stationed in Newark but was mobilized to the World Trade Center after the attack. Ms. Gallo stated that Mr. Niedermeyer spent a lot of time at Marigold Park and asked that Mr. Niedermeyer be the first person recognized in Heroes Park as a hero. Then any other hero who died in the line of duty or any civilian who died during a heroic act should be recognized.

Joseph Perry, Washington Avenue, asked for more information on a new firehouse and first aid building on Camp Evans property. Mayor Thomson replied that the Wall First Aid Squad indicated an interest in this area including a training center. The Township Committee discussed this and replied that this would not be a good location for this. Mayor Thomson also stated that when a transfer goes through a government agency, there are certain criteria that must be met. The Township agreed that Camp Evans site would be used for passive recreation. The transfer would have to be amended if the property was used for anything other than passive recreation. This would require public hearings and could take as much as another three years. The Township Committee agreed that this property would be used as passive recreation.

Tom Ross, Ramshorn Drive, thanked Deputy Mayor Burne and the Township Committee for renaming Marigold Park to Heroes Park. Mr. Ross stated that April 17<sup>th</sup> is Al Niedermeyer's

birthday and the Manasquan Park Association would like to dedicate a bench and plaque in his honor on that day.

Mr. Ross also advised the Committee that the builder working near Holly Boulevard and Lakewood Road has left a mess and asked that the area be cleaned. Mr. Verruni stated that he would look into the matter.

Sherrri West, Crestview Road, asked about the plans for the Wreck Pond area. Committeeman Peters stated that the Committee is waiting for a reply from the County. Mrs. West asked what the community group could do to further encourage this preservation. Mr. Peters asked that the group wait until the Township has a response from the County. Deputy Mayor Burne stated that this particular group is very actively working for this area and that the Committee is hoping to save this property. Committeeman Addonizio asked if each of the communities involved had paid their share for this property. Mr. McLaughlin replied no, but bills had been sent. Committeeman Devlin stated that the main focus is saving the Pond.

Joseph Perry, Washington Avenue, stated that Monmouth Boulevard near Camp Evans is a mess and asked if something could be done. Mayor Thomson replied that he would have this looked at, but the main concern there now is the pollution problem.

There being no further comments, Committeeman Peters made a motion to adjourn. Committeeman Addonizio seconded and all members voted yes. The meeting adjourned at 9:22 p.m.
