

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING  
OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE  
TOWNSHIP OF WALL, HELD IN THE  
MEETING ROOM, MUNICIPAL COMPLEX  
WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 10, 2005**

**Comments from Township Committee**

**Audience Participation**

Don Herbert, Atlantic Avenue, asked that the bicycle path be continued in the south for the people near Apple Ridge. Mr. Verruni replied that the Township received a grant of \$1 million. The project originally was proposed from Lakewood to the existing Route 18 right-of-way near Route 138. The Township is looking to see how much it would cost from the Municipal Complex north, and from the existing south location. This will be considered by the Township Committee in the future.

Mr. Herbert stated that when landscapers cut lawns, they blow all the trimmings down the sewers and asked that there be an ordinance introduced to prevent this because it is clogging all the sewers. Mr. Herbert will also contact the County on this.

Bill Myrtetus, Laurel Avenue, stated that two months ago he had asked about lead in the water which was substantially more than the last report. Mr. Verruni was supposed to investigate this. Mr. Verruni replied that he forwarded a copy of the report from the water company to Mr. Myrtetus, but there is no problem. Mr. Verruni will send another copy of the report.

Mr. Myrtetus stated that he used the E-bill on the Web to pay his water bill but it wouldn't accept his account number. Addresses were required. Mr. Myrtetus called the company and they said they would look at it. It was changed so that account numbers cannot be used. Mr. Myrtetus asked if taxes will be added to E-bills. Kate Elia responded that taxes will be added soon. Mr. Verruni noted that Wall is one of the first municipalities in Monmouth County to have this on-line service. The Township is also working on getting direct deposit.

Mr. Myrtetus referred to the Resolution concerning an agreement with the NJDOT traffic and asked who would be paying for this. Mayor Thomson responded that the DOT will pay.

Mr. Myrtetus asked about the cancellation of Capital Improvement Appropriation Balances. Mr. Verruni explained that there were open balances for an older sewer project. The

Township authorized debt but we didn't issue the bonds. This will reduce debt we have on the books.

Mr. Myrtetus asked about the agreement with the Jersey Agility Group. Mr. Verruni explained that this is the dog training program and they use a piece of property at Camp Evans.

Mr. Myrtetus referred to the incident with under-age children in the school district and asked how, when the report was given out, the names were not deleted. Attorney McLaughlin explained that the Township Committee had given the BOE a memo and set of documents involving criminal incidents that had not been reported to the Police Department. Part of this were police reports that deal with this. After the public meeting people, asked for copies. The Township Committee said to release it because it is public information. Both Mr. McLaughlin's office and the Police Department went through the report and deleted names of juveniles. This was a simple error by both Mr. McLaughlin's office and the Police Department. Hundreds of redactions were made but there were a couple that were missed.

Mr. Myrtetus asked where the report went and if he could have gotten a copy of it. Mr. Myrtetus stated that the Committee should take action on this. Mayor Thomson replied that the reports were redacted and deletions were made. The responsible agencies made apologies to everyone involved. Mayor Thomson said he understands everyone's frustration and the Committee is working hard to make sure this doesn't happen again.

Mr. Myrtetus asked if any disciplinary action was taken. Mayor Thomson stated that the people responsible have taken responsibility and they have been reprimanded. Mayor Thomson stated he is more upset with the incidents that happened. The information was given to the Board of Education after a long process with the superintendent and his not reporting these incidents. This had to be put together to prove that these incidents occurred.

Mr. Myrtetus stated that the hurt that was done, might be worse than the incidents themselves and stated that there should be some disciplinary action against the attorney. Mr. Myrtetus suggested a fine of perhaps \$5,000. This would show the public that the Committee realized this was a serious matter.

Ed Morgan, West Magnolia Avenue, said he was concerned when you look at what was going on with the Township Committee. They have been busy with the Board of Education. With the building going on in the township, there have been

many complaints about what went on without proper inspections. The Committee is in charge of this community, not the schools. Mr. Morgan asked if the Committee was aware of the cameras in the police locker room.

Mr. Morgan also mentioned the mistake made by the attorney's office and said that he wonders whether the Committee makes decisions or if the attorney is leading. Mr. Morgan stated that the Committee has been elected to take charge and perhaps they should. Committeeman Peters responded that as far as the building in this town over the last 3 ½ years, the Township of Wall has had fewer building permits than Manasquan. Mr. Morgan said there is a lot of building going on, but not enough inspectors. They are too busy. The Committee should have concentrated more on this than the Board of Education.

Attorney McLaughlin responded to the question concerning litigation about cameras in the locker room. The Township Committee was not aware that the investigation was going on. The Committee is not apprised of internal affairs by the Police Department. The camera was installed at the direction of the Monmouth County Prosecutor's office. The Committee was not informed of this.

Eagle Scout Robert Tufts arrived at the meeting. Mrs. Burne read the Proclamation honoring Robert and congratulated him. Mrs. Tufts thanked the Committee and De Hearn who has been very instrumental through the Historical Society with the Eagle Scouts. They have been very supportive of the Scouts, having done ten projects, and Mrs. Tufts hopes that the town recognizes them.

There being no further comments, Committeeman Peters made a motion to adjourn. Deputy Mayor Brosnan seconded and all members voted yes. The meeting adjourned at 8:15 p.m.
